CAMPAIGN EXPLAINED

Why is Bishop McNamara conducting a Capital Campaign now?

The school's most recent strategic plan, carefully considered the needs and challenges facing Bishop McNamara in the years ahead.

What are the objectives of the campaign?

The goal is to raise \$4.5 million dollars that will be used to cover the costs related to projects to be finalized upon the completion of this campaign are a new Chemistry Lab, an Academic Success Center, a School Chapel, the rebuilding of school's outdoor Athletic Complex, along with endowment growth. In addition to these physical improvements, we seek support from alumni, parents, grandparents, and friends in order to keep tuition affordable and low. An increased endowment also allows the school to offer more scholarships and financial aid to deserving students and maintain a diverse student body.

What about Bishop McNamara's commitment for faculty compensation?

A larger endowment will enable the school to strengthen salaries, benefits, and opportunities for professional development. This is vital, if Bishop McNamara is to continue attracting the finest faculty.

Who will be asked to support the capital campaign?

The Bishop McNamara community, which is comprised of board members, current parents, parents of graduates, Alumni, students, faculty, staff, and friends. Local businesses, corporations and foundations will also be asked to support the campaign.

How much should I pledge to the campaign?

Only you can decide how much to give. Your pledge should be based on your ability to give, your understanding of our needs, and your belief in the mission of Bishop McNamara. Keep in mind that with your loyal support, Bishop McNamara will achieve its \$4.5 million dollar goal.

Why increase the endowment?

Gifts to endowment are invested, and only the interest used. Thus, a strong endowment provides Bishop McNamara with funds, which are never depleted. Endowment funds provide the resources Bishop McNamara needs in order to keep tuition affordable and low. An Increased endowment also allows the school to offer more scholarships and financial aid to deserving students and maintain a diverse student body.

Can I specify where I'd like to apply my gift?

Yes. Donors may designate gifts.

Does The Irish Fund need to continue while the capital campaign is in effect?

Yes. A strong annual giving program (The Irish Fund) is required to cover financial aid awards and those portions of the operating budget not funded by tuition and fees.

Will I be notified when the payments on my pledge are due?

Yes. Regular reminders based on intervals you specify when making your pledge will be sent to you.

Are there other ways to give outside of a cash gift?

Gifts of appreciated stock and bonds, real estate, life insurance and charitable trusts, and other planned gifts will be greatly appreciated.



DEVELOP AN ACADEMIC SUCCESS CENTER.



The focus on the project would be to build a first-class athletic complex, one in which multiple sports could occupy to restore and reinvigorate our physical school plant. This athletic complex will be a new front porch to our school campus, inspiring "Pride of the Irish" in our current students, our prospective students, our alumni, and the entire Bishop McNamara Community.

WAYS TO GIVE

The Campaign for Bishop McNamara offers a wide range of opportunities for donors at all levels to make a difference in the quality and future of Bishop McNamara Catholic School. You can participate in the campaign by making a commitment that permits both flexibility and time to complete payment. Because the school's needs are urgent, we hope that most commitments will be completed within 36 to 60 months. However, if you require a longer period of time, we would be pleased to work with you to arrange such a gift. There are a variety of ways you can make a gift to Continuing the Legacy: The Centennial Campaign for Bishop McNamara. Each presents certain advantages. All, of course, are tax deductible within the limits specified by the IRS code. We recommend that you consult with an attorney or financial advisor when planning your commitment.

Gifts of Cash

Gifts of cash qualify for a charitable deduction in the year given and are limited to 60 percent of your adjusted gross income annually. Any amount given over this limit is eligible for a five-year carry over.

Gifts of Appreciated Securities

Gifts of appreciated securities held for more than one year permit a donor to use the full value of the security at the time of donation as a tax deduction, while avoiding the capital gains tax that would be imposed if the security were sold.

Gift from a Qualified Charitable Distribution

A qualified charitable distribution, (QCD), also known as a charitable IRA rollover, is a tax -efficient method for giving large and small gifts. You transfer a gift directly from your individual retirement account (IRA) to a qualified charity. It counts towards your required minimum distribution (RMD) and you avoid income taxes on the amount transferred.

Gifts of Property

Gifts of property, including residence, farm, vacation home, jewelry, art, etc., can provide significant benefits to the school and to the donor. The specialized help of appraisers and tax advisors is necessary to make such a gift.

Gifts of Life Insurance

Gifts of Life Insurance can provide a way to make a sizeable gift at a relatively low cost. Again, consulting with your attorney or tax advisor is important. Bequests and Life Payment Plans Bequests and life payment plans are excellent ways to participate in the campaign at levels you might not ordinarily consider. These include a bequest in one's will as well as various trust instruments.

Members of the Advancement Team at Bishop McNamara will be happy to assist your own financial advisors in finding an attractive plan for your particular situation. The main consideration in making any type of gift to the campaign is to find a way that brings joy to you and your family – joy in supporting a cause in which you believe and value.
