

### **Bishop Ronald Hicks Visits Bishop McNamara**

On Wednesday, March 17th Bishop Ronald Hicks made his first visit to Bishop McNamara Catholic School where he celebrated Mass with the freshmen class. We were excited to have Bishop Hicks here on our very special St. Patrick's Day as we celebrated being Irish!

Several pastors from our local parishes were here to concelebrate the Mass. Our freshmen were escorted to Mass by a bagpiper continuing with this annual tradition for our freshmen students.

Bishop Ronald Hicks, a native of Harvey, IL grew up in South Holland, IL where he attended St. Jude the Apostle Parish and Grade School. He graduated from Quigley Seminary South in 1985. He received his B.A. in Philosophy from Niles College of Loyola University Chicago in 1989 and his Master of Divinity degree in 1994 and his Doctor of Ministry degree in 2003, both from the University of St. Mary of the Lake in Mundelein. IL.

Bishop Hicks served as an Associate Pastor at Our Lady of Mercy Parish in Chicago from 1994 to 1996 and then at St. Elizabeth Seton Parish in Orland Hills, IL from 1996 to 1999. From 1999 to 2005, he lived and ministered at St.

Joseph College Seminary as the Dean of Formation.

In July 2005, with permission from Cardinal Francis George, Bishop Hicks moved from Chicago to El Salvador to begin his five-year term as Regional Director of Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH) in Central America. NPH is a home dedicated to caring for more than 3,400 orphaned and abandoned children in nine Latin American and Caribbean countries.

From 2010 to 2014, Bishop Hicks served as the Dean of Formation at Mundelein Seminary. During that time, he assisted with weekend Masses at St. Jerome Parish in Rogers Park, Chicago, IL.

Bishop Hicks was appointed Vicar General of the Archdiocese by Cardinal Cupich on January 1, 2015. On September 17, 2018 he was ordained an Auxiliary Bishop at Holy Name Cathedral in Chicago.

On July 17, 2020, Pope Francis announced that he had named Bishop Hicks as the sixth Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Joliet, IL. He was installed at the Cathedral of St. Raymond Nonnatus in Joliet, IL on September 29, 2020.



She says, "Just because they have a hearing loss does not mean they are any less capable of doing amazing things. These are some of the most resilient children I have ever met, and they have so much to offer this world!"

Because of the pandemic, Haley had to navigate teaching preschoolers with hearing loss virtually. It took months to fine tune the way she delivered instruction over the computer that was engaging, still met her student's needs, and wasn't too overwhelming. She is glad to be back to teaching in person! Haley adds, "One thing I learned about teaching during a pandemic is that we need to give children a lot of credit. Their schedules and routines are disrupted. They don't fully grasp what has happened and they've had to adapt in a big way. It's taught me to have a deeper understanding of my student's behaviors and how it is impacting their little minds and emotions."

Haley earned her bachelor's degree in deaf education with a minor in communication sciences and disorders at Illinois State University and is continuing her studies there, getting her master's in special education with behavior interventionist endorsements so she can teach students with both hearing loss and an additional disability.

Through her work, Haley will be a co-host of a podcast, All Ears at Child's Voice: A Hearing Loss, where topics covered relate to hearing loss and aim to connect parents of children with hearing loss to the professionals that serve them.

Haley lives in Chicago. She is on the Associate Board of the Foundation for Hearing and Speech Rehabilitation where they work to connect families of children with hearing loss in the Chicagoland area by putting on fun events as a way for the kids to socialize and for parents to network with one another.

We opened St. Mary's School in August and we've never had to shut down. We've only had four household cases of COVID-19 all year and none of them originated at school. We are very proud of this accomplishment and are convinced that the power of prayer (and masking, distancing, cohorting, and cleaning) had something to do with it!"

Melanie says that even through all the stress of leading a school during a pandemic, she has found great joy in what she does. She gets to be with her kids each day and help shape the school that they've always loved. She is able to mentor the teachers and reassure them that what they do is appreciated and needed. She loves building relationships with the students and enjoys working with the families. She is able to attend Mass, listen to songs and participate in traditions that literally bring her right back to her Catholic school days each time. Melanie says, "I am thrilled to be planning for the future of Catholic education in our town and look forward to seeing our school grow each year moving forward."
